

Shih Hsin University Regulations Governing the Admission Scholarship for New Indonesian Students

This English translation is for reference only and has not been officially verified.
The Chinese version shall prevail in all respects.

Approved at the 9th Administrative Meeting of the 1st Semester of Academic Year 114 on October 9, 2025.
Amended and approved at the 4th Administrative Meeting of the 2nd Semester of Academic Year 114 on March 26, 2026.

Article 1

Shih Hsin University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”), in order to encourage outstanding new Indonesian students to enroll and pursue their studies at the University, hereby formulates these “Shih Hsin University Regulations Governing the Admission Scholarship for New Indonesian Students” (hereinafter referred to as “these Regulations”).

Article 2

“New Indonesian students” are defined as follows:

Those who hold Indonesian nationality and are admitted as new students to the University’s daytime undergraduate (bachelor’s) programs through any of the following channels: international student admission application, separate admission for overseas Chinese students, or placement by the Overseas Joint Admission Committee.

Article 3

The funding source for this scholarship shall be covered by the University’s budget as allocated for the relevant academic year.

Article 4

The allocation of this scholarship, the criteria for award, and the method of disbursement are as follows:

New Indonesian students who have obtained formal admission to the University and have enrolled may apply for a scholarship that provides a full waiver of the total amount of tuition and miscellaneous fees for the first academic year (excluding Student Group Insurance premiums and medical insurance premiums for overseas students / National Health Insurance premiums). Subject to the budget approved for the relevant academic year, the number of awards shall be limited to a maximum of thirty (30) recipients.

Article 5

Applicants for this scholarship shall prepare the following documents and submit an application to the University’s Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs within the prescribed deadline:

1. One (1) application form.
2. One (1) letter of recommendation (which must be issued by an Indonesian local

association of Taiwanese alumni/students who have studied in Taiwan, a secondary school principal, a partner school, or a partner institution).

3. One (1) copy of the applicant's pre-admission high school transcript.

Article 6

The review of this scholarship shall be conducted by the International and Cross-Strait Exchange Committee.

Article 7

Recipients of this scholarship may not concurrently apply for or receive any other scholarships offered by the University for the first academic year.

Article 8

If a recipient of this scholarship takes a leave of absence, withdraws, or transfers to another institution during a semester, the tuition and miscellaneous fees waived under these Regulations for that semester shall not be refunded, and the scholarship shall be discontinued from the following semester.

Where any materials submitted for review are found to be forged or untrue, or where any violation of relevant laws and regulations is verified upon investigation, the University shall, in addition to pursuing the relevant responsibilities depending on the circumstances, revoke the recipient's eligibility for the scholarship, recover any scholarship already received, and prohibit the individual from reapplying for this scholarship.

Article 9

These Regulations shall take effect upon approval by the Administrative Meeting and promulgation after being submitted to, and approved by, the President of the University. The same procedure shall apply to any amendments.
